PASTOR'S CORNER:

Palm Sunday: The message of Palm Sunday is one of promise and absolute faith. It shows the importance of believing God, even before we see any final results. Jesus' arrival into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday is foretold in Zecharia 9:9, 'See, your king comes to you, gentle and riding on a donkey."



Holy Thursday 7:30 PM: The Triduum commences with Holy Thursday, During the evening Mass, the Church re-enacts the Last Supper, where Jesus instituted the Eucharist and the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. The "washing of the feet" ceremony symbolizes the priest's role as a servant, mirroring Jesus washing the feet of His disciples. We end the Mass by processing with the Eucharist to the Parish Hall for Adoration.

Good Friday The second day of the Triduum is Good Friday.

12:00 Noon: Seven lay members of our parish will share a short reflection on the seven last words of Jesus. Come for this spiritual experience.



1:00: Silent prayer and meditation

1:30: The 8th Grade students will perform the Live Stations of the Cross. Don't miss this experience to see the reality of the passion of Christ by the 8th Grade.

7:30 PM: The Good Friday liturgy, emphasizes the centrality of the cross in Christian faith. There is no Mass on Good Friday; instead, the liturgy focuses on the **Veneration of the Cross** and the distribution of the **Eucharist** consecrated on Holy Thursday.

Holy Saturday and the Easter Vigil: The third day of the Triduum encompasses **Holy Saturday** and culminates in the **Easter Vigil**. Holy Saturday is a day of quiet anticipation, as the Church awaits the **Resurrection**. The Easter Vigil, held after sundown on Holy Saturday, is the most significant liturgical celebration of the year. It begins in darkness, symbolizing the tomb, and gradually transitions to light as the **Paschal Candle** is lit. The vigil includes readings from the **Old Testament**, recounting salvation history, and the **Baptismal Liturgy**, welcoming a new member into the Church. Finally, the joyous proclamation of the **Resurrection** resounds, and the faithful celebrate the triumph of life over death.

TENEBRAE: **Holy Thursday – Holy Saturday 8:00 AM** each day. We will host the Sacred Prayer of TENEBRAE, essentially the Divine Office of Readings and Morning Prayer.

In summary, **the Sacred Triduum** unites the last three days of Jesus' earthly life—the events of His Passion, Crucifixion, and Resurrection—into one liturgical day, revealing the profound unity of Christ's **Paschal Mystery**.

LA ESQUINA DEL PASTOR:

Domingo de Ramos: El mensaje del Domingo de Ramos es de promesa y fe absoluta. Muestra la importancia de creer en Dios, incluso antes de ver los resultados finales. La llegada de Jesús a Jerusalén el Domingo de Ramos está predicha en Zacarías 9:9: "Mira, tu rey viene a ti, manso y montado en un burro".



Jueves Santo 7:30 PM: El Triduo comienza con el Jueves Santo, Durante la Misa de la tarde, la Iglesia recrea la Última Cena, donde Jesús instituyó la Eucaristía y el Santo Sacrificio de la Misa. La ceremonia del "lavatorio de los pies" simboliza el papel del sacerdote como siervo, reflejando a Jesús lavando los pies de sus discípulos. Terminamos la Misa procesionando con la Eucaristía al Salón Parroquial para la Adoración.

Viernes Santo El segundo día del Triduo es el Viernes Santo.

12:00 Mediodía: Siete miembros laicos de nuestra parroquia compartirán una breve reflexión sobre las siete últimas palabras de Jesús. Ven a vivir esta experiencia espiritual.



1:00: Oración silenciosa y meditación

1:30: Los estudiantes de 8º grado realizarán el Vía Crucis en vivo. No te pierdas esta experiencia para ver la realidad de la pasión de Cristo por el 8º grado.

7:30 PM: La liturgia del Viernes Santo, enfatiza la centralidad de la cruz en la fe cristiana. No hay misa el Viernes Santo; en cambio, la liturgia se centra en la **Veneración de la Cruz** y la distribución de la **Eucaristía** consagrada el Jueves Santo.

Sábado Santo y Vigilia Pascual: El tercer día del Triduo abarca el Sábado Santo y culmina con la Vigilia Pascual. El Sábado Santo es un día de tranquila anticipación, mientras la Iglesia espera la Resurrección. La Vigilia Pascual, que se celebra después de la puesta del sol del Sábado Santo, es la celebración litúrgica más significativa del año. Comienza en la oscuridad, simbolizando la tumba, y gradualmente pasa a la luz a medida que se enciende el Cirio Pascual. La vigilia incluye lecturas del Antiguo Testamento, relatando la historia de la salvación, y la liturgia bautismal, dando la bienvenida a un nuevo miembro a la Iglesia. Finalmente, resuena el anuncio gozoso de la Resurrección y los fieles celebran el triunfo de la vida sobre la muerte.

TENEBRAE: Jueves Santo – Sábado Santo 8:00 AM todos los días. Realizaremos la Sagrado Servicio de las" Tinieblas", esencialmente el Oficio Divino de Lecturas y Oración de la Mañana.

En resumen, el **Triduo Sagrado** une los últimos tres días de la vida terrena de Jesús —los acontecimientos de su Pasión, Crucifixión y Resurrección— en un solo día litúrgico, revelando la profunda unidad del **Misterio Pascual de Cristo** .




