Update on Building Renovation

The insulation was put in place in the walls and we passed inspection on that and received the okay to cover the walls. However, the electrical inspector insisted that he be provided with stamped drawings showing that we are meeting Title 24 energy efficiency standards. The construction team is currently working on getting the drawings from an Electrical Engineer and submitting them to the city. This will delay us a few days.

The shear wall (a layer of plywood that encases the entire room for stability in earthquakes) has been installed and drywall has been put in place everywhere but the ceiling. Once we have the stamped drawings that the inspector is requesting and he signs off on them, we will proceed with the installation of the drywall on the ceiling.

Pastor's Corner

Imagine if I came to your home with a large plate with a silver cake cover on top **and said, "Yesterday I baked a delicious,** moist, chocolate cake with buttercream

frosting." Once you recovered from the surprise that I baked a cake, you'd be even more surprised if I said, "As I was eating the last piece, I thought of you. Just before I took the final bite, I put down my fork and thought, 'I'm taking these crumbs to my friend.""

How would you feel?

Contrast that emotion with the one you would have if I knocked on your door and said, "I pulled this cake out of the oven, frosted it, and brought it over for you to enjoy – although I did bring a fork in case you want to share!"

That's a very different scenario, and it contrasts the way we treat God and the way He treats us. We tend to offer Him crumbs, while He offers us His best, and He offers it to us first.

This principle is stated clearly in IJohn 4:19. "We love because He first loved us." God always is the initiator in our relationship with Him. You came to church today because His grace prompted you and you responded. Any good we do is done in cooperation with Him, and in *response* to His action in us *first*.

Not only does God act first, He gives us His best. In describing Jesus, St. John the Evangelist says the eternal Word "became flesh and made his dwelling among us, and we saw his glory, the glory as of the Father's only Son." (John 1:14) St. Paul calls him "the firstborn among many brothers." (Romans 8:29) And the Father sent His Son as a sacrifice. He didn't redeem us with an apostle, or an angel, or a prophet or preacher. He gave His best.

Jesus is not only the firstborn, he is the firstfruit. **St. Paul says, "now Christ has been raised from the** dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen **asleep." (I Cor 15:20). 'Firstfruit' is a term for the** beginning of a harvest – literally the first apples of an apple harvest, or first grapes, or first grains of wheat. When you go to a roadside fruit stand, the farmer **gives you a sample as if to say, "Try this** – I am confi **dent you'll want more." Jesus is the firstfruit of God's harvest. He will do with those who believe** what He did with Jesus: call us out of the grave. (To be continued!)

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

Durante todo el mes de septiembre se celebra el mes de la herencia hispana. Esta fiesta responde a una presencia hispana que tiene su inicio con la llegada de los españoles a la Florida en 1513, hace 501 años. Los españoles estuvieron en 24 de los ahora 50 estados de Estados Unidos. Eventualmente, como bien sabemos, Florida, el Suroeste y Puerto Rico pasaron a manos de los estadounidenses.

Desde nuestra incorporación a este país hemos ido creciendo en presencia e influencia. La primera obra literaria en español publicada en EE. UU., fue un sermón de don José Agustín Caballero en 1804. En 1808 inició la prensa hispana en EE. UU. con el periódico El Misisipi en Nueva Orleáns. Este fue el primero de los medios de comunicación en español en esta nación. En 1822 se eligió el primer político Hispano como representante estatal de Florida. En 1865 la primera oficina para la pastoral católica entre los hispanos nombró al sacerdote Gabriel Serrano *pastor hispanorium* (pastor de los hispanos) en San Francisco, California. En 1970 el sacerdote Patricio Flores fue el primer hispano en ser consagrado como Obispo en y para Estados Unidos. En 1972 celebramos el Primer Encuentro Nacional de Católicos Hispanos donde nos auto nominamos un pueblo en marcha. Y seguimos caminando. -Fray Gilberto Cavazos-Glz, OFM, Copyright © J. S.
