A Message from Fr. Roberto

What Does Jesus' Resurrection Really Mean?

We are at about the halfway point of the seven-week Easter season, and, perhaps because of the Covid-19 pandemic, the ongoing social distancing we are undergoing and the anxiety we are feeling about the future, we don't quite feel the impact of Jesus' resurrection. So, I would like to remind you just what the resurrection of Jesus means for us.

First of all, the resurrection of Jesus is the single most important belief we have as Catholics because if Jesus had not risen from the dead, he would have been just another prophet who died for his beliefs. Jesus' resurrection confirms his declaration that he was not just a prophet but the Messiah and the Son of God. Because Jesus died and rose again, our sins are forgiven and we have received the gift of eternal life. If Jesus had not risen from the dead, at the very best we would be like religious Jews still awaiting the Messiah.

But another important thing about Jesus' resurrection is that it proves to us that love is stronger than hatred, that good conquers evil, that grace overcomes sin and that life wins out over death, not just at the end of our lives, but even now. What I am saying is that Jesus' resurrection is not simply a historic event that took place 2,000 years ago for which we gather every year and shout "Hooray for Jesus!" It is the foundation of hope in our lives. It is our guarantee that no matter what awful thing happens in our lives today, God will get us through, including this current pandemic, its future economic effects, any natural disaster that is to come, any war we may enter into, or any personal problem we may have to endure in our lives. And the reason we know that God will get us through is because God raised Jesus from the dead. Jesus' resurrection is the guarantee of our resurrection, again, not just at the end of our lives, but after every death-like experience we have during our lives.

As our Catholic Church teaches, the death and resurrection of Jesus is the single most important event in the history of the entire universe – even more important than creation itself. If Jesus had not risen from the dead, our Catholic Church, our Christian faith would not exist. Just read the Acts of the Apostles in the New Testament and you will see that the first and most important thing the apostles preached was not about love, morality, forgiveness, prayer or heaven; they preached that Jesus rose from the dead. Then once people believed that, the apostles and the early Christians explained to them the rest of Jesus' life and teachings.

So, the first question I have for each of you is do you believe – deep down in your soul – that Jesus rose from the dead? If not, then you need to get on your knees and ask God to help you believe that. The second question I have for you is do you live as if you believe Jesus rose from the dead? In other words, do you live as if you believe that love is stronger than hatred, that good conquers evil, that grace overcomes sin and that life wins out over death? If not, then you have your work cut out for you.

Now please understand that it is very normal, human and okay to struggle to believe, to doubt, and to question Jesus' resurrection – or any other belief we have as Catholics – I struggle sometimes too. But open your heart to the Holy Spirit, pray, ask God for guidance and for faith. Then, with time and God's help, you too will come to know that out of struggle, failure, chaos and death, there will always be new life because Jesus rose from the dead.

Un Mensaje de Padre Roberto

¿Qué Significa Realmente la Resurrección de Jesús?

Estamos a punto de la mitad de la temporada de Pascua de siete semanas y, tal vez debido a la pandemia de Covid-19, el distanciamiento social que estamos experimentando y la ansiedad que sentimos por el futuro, no sentimos el impacto de la resurrección de Jesús. Entonces, me gustaría recordarles lo que la resurrección de Jesús significa para nosotros.

En primer lugar, la resurrección de Jesús es la creencia más importante que tenemos como católicos porque si Jesús no hubiera resucitado de entre los muertos, habría sido solo otro profeta que murió por sus creencias. La resurrección de Jesús confirma su declaración de que él no era solo un profeta sino el Mesías y el Hijo de Dios. Debido a que Jesús murió y resucitó, nuestros pecados son perdonados y hemos recibido el regalo de la vida eterna. Si Jesús no hubiera resucitado de la muerte, en el mejor de los casos, seríamos como judíos religiosos que todavía esperan al Mesías.

Pero otra cosa importante sobre la resurrección de Jesús es que nos demuestra que el amor es más fuerte que el odio, que el bien vence al mal, que la gracia supera al pecado y que la vida somete a la muerte, no solo al final de nuestras vidas, sino incluso ahora. Lo que estoy diciendo es que la resurrección de Jesús no es simplemente un evento histórico que tuvo lugar hace 2.000 años por el cual nos reunimos todos los años y gritamos "¡Hurra por Jesús!" Es la base de la esperanza en nuestras vidas. Es nuestra garantía de que, sin importar lo horrible que suceda en nuestras vidas hoy, Dios nos ayudará a seguir adelante, incluida esta pandemia actual, sus efectos económicos futuros, cualquier desastre natural que esté por venir, cualquier guerra en la que podamos entrar, o cualquier problema personal que podamos tener que soportar en nuestras vidas. Y la razón por la que sabemos que Dios nos ayudará es porque Dios resucitó a Jesús de la muerte. La resurrección de Jesús es la garantía de nuestra resurrección, nuevamente, no solo al final de nuestras vidas, sino después de cada experiencia similar a la muerte que tenemos durante nuestras vidas.

Como enseña nuestra Iglesia Católica, la muerte y resurrección de Jesús es el evento más importante en la historia del universo entero, incluso más importante que la misma creación. Si Jesús no hubiera resucitado de la muerte, nuestra Iglesia Católica, nuestra fe cristiana no existiría. Simplemente lee los Hechos de los Apóstoles en el Nuevo Testamento y verás que lo primero y más importante que predicaron los apóstoles no era sobre el amor, la moral, el perdón, la oración o el cielo; predicaron que Jesús resucitó de entre los muertos. Luego, una vez que la gente creía eso, los apóstoles y los primeros cristianos les explicaron el resto de la vida y las enseñanzas de Jesús.

Entonces, la primera pregunta que tengo para cada uno de ustedes es: ¿crees, en el fondo de tu alma, que Jesús resucitó de entre los muertos? Si no, entonces debes ponerte de rodillas y pedirle a Dios que te ayude a creer eso. La segunda pregunta que tengo para ti es: ¿vives como si creyeras que Jesús resucitó de entre los muertos? En otras palabras, ¿vives como si creyeras que el amor es más fuerte que el odio, que el bien vence al mal, que la gracia supera al pecado y que la vida somete a la muerte? Si no, entonces tienes que hacer más trabajo en tu fe.

Ahora, por favor, comprendan que es muy normal, humano y bien luchar para creer, dudar y cuestionar la resurrección de Jesús – o cualquier otra creencia que tengamos como católicos – a veces también lucho yo. Pero abre tu corazón al Espíritu Santo, ora, pídele a Dios orientación y fe. Entonces, con el tiempo y la ayuda de Dios, tú también sabrás que desde la lucha, el fracaso, el caos y la muerte, siempre vendrá nueva vida porque Jesús resucitó de entre los muertos.
