

Pastor's Corner

When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, in the days of King Herod, behold, magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem... Matthew 2:1

(The following was excerpted from a blog post at the Western Dominican Province website).

While the Christmas creche is often attributed to Saint Francis, the Feast of the Epiphany is a day associated with the Dominicans. Not only do we celebrate the revelation of Christ to all the nations (the mission of every Dominican), but one of Saint

Dominic's favorite examples of how to pray was based on that of the Magi from the East, who bowed down in homage before the Lord.

At the end of the Christmas season, Epiphany celebrates the manifestation of God to the nations. Just as the Lord invited Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar to follow a star, he invites each of us to seek him **out. After finding him in his mother's arm, we cannot** help but humble ourselves and adore our Savior. Strengthened by our time in his presence, we go forth to proclaim the name of Jesus to the world.

One way to do this is by marking our doors with the traditional Epiphany blessing: the numbers of the new year and the letters C, M, B: the initials of the Magi and the phrase *Christus mansionem benedicat* (May Christ bless this house). For 2017, the blessing reads: 20 + C + M + B + 17. As we do so, we may offer the following prayer from *Catholic Household Blessings and Prayers*:

"Lord God of heaven and earth, You revealed Your only-begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Fill us with the light of Christ, that our concern for others may reflect Your love. Bless this house, all who inhabit it, and all who pass through these doors. May this home and this family be a light for all who are lost and afraid, a place of peace and hospitality for those in need, and a sign that You are indeed God-with-us. And when our long journey has ended, lead us all by the star of Your mercy, that we may come home to You, to the dwelling place You have prepared for us in heaven. Grant this through Christ our Lord. Amen."

The following is an excerpt from a letter to Fr. Michael Fones from Sr. Joseph Marie, the formation director for the cloistered nuns in Menlo Park, CA.

"We have four sisters in formation. Sr. Mary Isabel, is in the transition process and will make Solemn vows soon, God willing. The sisters in the white veils are under my care while they're being formed. They are a great bunch and a fun ball of energy!

In May, our sister postulant received her habit with a new name, Sr. André Marie of Divine Mercy. Sister is a pharmacist, so she gave me a "prescription" to drink coconut water as a remedy for migraines. It works ... about 90% of the time, which is terrific!

We continue to receive a few more aspirants throughout the year and two have expressed interest in coming back... Sometimes all it takes is for someone to ask a young woman if she has ever thought about religious life. About 95% of the young women told us they've never heard of our monastery; they didn't even know there exists such a thing as cloistered Dominican nuns.

As vocation directress who helps these young women discern their vocation, I'm grateful for the journey. It is a sacred path to share someone's spiritual journey and as one of our eldest sisters constantly reminds me...I'm blessed...because God is teaching me new things all the time. As novice mistress I've been stretched beyond my comfort zone and comprehension. But I trust God knows what He is doing! I can feel my brain stretching, bones cracking, vices come to light, and spiritual joy from the growth...but the growing pains are very uncomfortable to deal with at times!


As you see, a nun's life is not boring!"

Becoming Catholic

What does that mean? Well there are three levels of meaning.

For some who are not baptized in the Catholic faith or a recognized Christian faith and are seeking baptism and becoming a member of the Catholic Church.
