A Message from Fr. Roberto

Happy Father's Day!

Many blessings to all of you fathers as well as to those of you who, even if you have not physically had children, have nonetheless taken on a father's role. May the Lord bless all you men for your hard work, dedication and the guidance you have given others.

God of the Ordinary

As I mentioned in last week's bulletin message, we are now entering into the longest single season of the Church's liturgical year: Ordinary Time, which lasts from the day after Pentecost until Advent, usually toward the end of November – almost six months! Again, as I said last week, the name "Ordinary Time" can be misleading. It does not mean ordinary in the sense that nothing is happening, because with God there is always something happening; in other words, God is always up to something! The season of Ordinary Time refers to the **ordinal or ordered** numbering of the Sundays during the season, such as 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, etc., all the way to the 34th Sunday of Ordinary Time which the Church celebrates as the Feast of Christ the King.

This alternation during our Catholic liturgical year between special seasons and ordinary time reflects the rhythm of human life: there are times we celebrate special events, anniversaries and meaningful periods, but most of life is the ordinary and day-to-day living out of our relationships and responsibilities. And this is where God is most often found: in the ordinary times of our lives. Most often, our Christian living and growth does not come from spectacular moments of inspired prayer or insight, but rather from dealing with the daily demands and circumstances of family life, school, work, church and leisure; not so much from the "mountaintop experiences" we have now and then as from the daily flow of our lives in the valley below.

Unfortunately, too often we Christians want God to touch our lives in dramatic ways, to speak to us through angelic visions or miraculous interventions. And, while God certainly can be found in the spectacular, most often God is a God of the ordinary. He reveals himself to us through ordinary daily circumstances, through the ordinary people around us and in the routines of our daily lives.

One of the struggles Jesus faced during his lifetime was that he was considered too ordinary by the Jewish people, especially by their religious leaders. He was not some conquering military or political leader; not a wealthy, royal or influential person of nobility; not even a thunderous, wonder-working, charismatic prophet. Instead, he was a simple carpenter's son from a backwater town in Galilee. His own townsfolk and relatives in Nazareth could not accept him as anyone special, much less as the Messiah, because they knew him; he was too ordinary for them (see, for example, Matthew 13: 54-58).

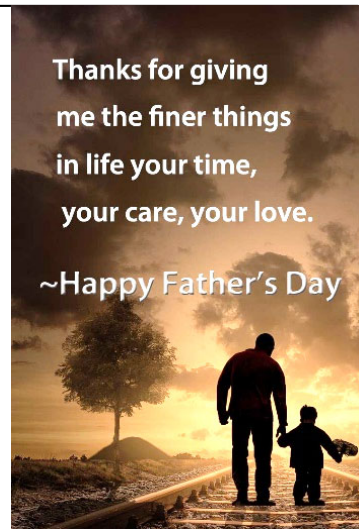
So, remember, you don't have to travel to sacred shrines or make a pilgrimage to a distant country to find God. God is right in the middle of your everyday, ordinary life. Our God is, in many ways, the God of the ordinary.

"God is manifest in the ordinary, in the actual, in the daily, in the now, in the concrete incarnations of life. Our experiences of ordinary life will transform us if we are willing to experience them fully...God's revelations are through the concrete and the specific. Spirituality is not a Platonic world of ideas and theories about which you can be right or wrong. Revelation is not something you measure, but something – or Someone – you meet!"

Un Mensaje de Padre Roberto

¡Feliz Día del Padre!

Muchas bendiciones para todos ustedes, padres, así como para aquellos de ustedes que, incluso si no han tenido hijos físicamente, han asumido el papel de padre. Que el Señor los bendiga a todos ustedes por su arduo trabajo, dedicación y la guía que les han brindado a los demás.

El Dios de lo Ordinario

Como mencioné en mi mensaje del boletín de la semana pasada, ahora estamos entrando en la temporada más larga del año litúrgico de la Iglesia: el Tiempo Ordinario, que dura desde el día después de Pentecostés hasta el Adviento, generalmente hacia fines de noviembre – ¡casi seis meses! Una vez más, como dije la semana pasada, el nombre "Tiempo ordinario" puede ser engañoso. No significa ordinario en el sentido de que nada esté sucediendo, porque con Dios siempre hay algo que sucede; Dios siempre está actuando y realizando algo. La temporada del Tiempo Ordinario se refiere, en primer lugar, a la numeración **ordinal** de los domingos durante la temporada, como el 1°, 2°, 3°, 4°, etc., hasta el 34° Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario que la Iglesia celebra como La Fiesta de Cristo Rey. Pero el Tiempo Ordinario también se refiere al hecho de que no hay celebraciones dominicales extraordinarias durante esta temporada, en contraste con las fiestas extraordinarias de Navidad y Pascua, por ejemplo.

Esta alternación litúrgica entre fiestas especiales y el tiempo ordinario a lo largo del año refleja el ritmo de la vida humana: en ocasiones celebramos eventos especiales, aniversarios y períodos significativos, pero la mayor parte de la vida es la vida cotidiana de nuestras relaciones y responsabilidades. Y aquí es donde Dios se encuentra con más frecuencia: en los tiempos ordinarios de nuestras vidas. En la mayoría de los casos, nuestra vida y crecimiento cristiano no proviene de momentos espectaculares de oración o discernimiento inspirado, sino de ocuparnos de las exigencias y circunstancias cotidianas de la vida familiar, escolar, laboral, eclesíastica y de recreación; no tanto de las "experiencias en la cima de la montaña" que tenemos de vez en cuando como del flujo diario de nuestras vidas en el valle de abajo.

Desafortunadamente, con demasiada frecuencia los cristianos queremos que Dios toque nuestras vidas de manera dramática, que nos hable a través de visiones angélicas o intervenciones milagrosas. Y, mientras que Dios ciertamente se puede encontrar en lo espectacular, por lo general, Dios es un Dios de lo ordinario. Él se revela a nosotros a través de las circunstancias cotidianas ordinarias, a través de la gente ordinaria que nos rodea y en las rutinas de nuestra vida cotidiana.

Una de las luchas que Jesús enfrentó durante su vida fue que, para los judíos y especialmente los líderes religiosos, era demasiado ordinario. No era un conquistador militar o líder político, ni una persona rica, real o influyente de nobleza, ni siquiera un profeta carismático e imponente. Simplemente era hijo de carpintero de un pueblo desconocido de Galilea. Sus propios habitantes y parientes en Nazaret no podían aceptarlo como alguien especial, mucho menos como el Mesías, porque lo conocían; era demasiado ordinario para ellos (ver, por ejemplo, Mateo 13, 54-58).

Por lo tanto, recuerda que no tienes que viajar a santuarios sagrados o hacer una peregrinación a un país lejano para encontrar a Dios. Dios está justo en medio de tu vida cotidiana y ordinaria. En muchas maneras nuestro Dios es el Dios de lo ordinario.

"Dios se manifiesta en lo ordinario, en lo real, en lo cotidiano, en lo presente, en las encarnaciones concretas de la vida. Nuestras experiencias de vida ordinaria nos transformarán si estamos dispuestos a experimentarlas plenamente... Las revelaciones de Dios son a través del concreto y del específico. La espiritualidad no es un mundo platónico de ideas y teorías sobre las cuales puedes estar correcto o incorrecto. La revelación no es algo que midas, ¡sino algo – o Alguien – que encuentras!"
