## THE RICHNESS OF LIFE IN CHRIST

Today we have the beautiful story of the woman promised a child, the wonderful exhortation about life in Christ, and a powerful instruction from Jesus. An embarrassment of riches? Not if we take Jesus' words about "welcome" to heart. The many challenges and blessings offered to us today by Elisha, Paul, and Jesus should be cause for rejoicing, and welcomed heartily into our lives. And, like the great treat that they are, they should be enjoyed and shared generously with others.

Today's reading from Romans was chosen very early in the liturgical life of the Church to be the sole apostolic instruction received by candidates for baptism at the Easter Vigil. This illustrates its importance as a core belief, and as a means of comprehending the story of the Resurrection. Christ's resurrection is not merely a story about something that he underwent once upon a time, but it is our story, the story of how we joined the other members of the one Body of Christ, the church. We were not only dead, but we were buried; not ultimately buried, but raised to eternal life with Christ.

For priests to take a day of prayer, to meet with a spiritual director or confessor:

For Jesus Caritas meetings; (5-7 priests who meet monthly for Scripture sharing, contemplative prayer before the Eucharist, a shared review of life, and fellowship over a meal)

For the bishops of California to gather for their annual meeting:

The friars in the priory have used the House of Prayer as a meeting place for a day of reflection and study together.



### Pastor's corner

During a persecution in 303, at which time Christians were forbidden to gather to worship, one of the martyrs was recorded as

saying: "Without fear of any kind we have celebrated the Lord's Supper, because it cannot be missed; that is our law." Today, many Christians break the third commandment which tells us to "remember to keep holy the Sabbath," which for Christians is "the Lord's Day" – Sunday.

In a letter titled, "The Lord's Day" (Dies Domini [DD]), St. John Paul II wrote, "man's relationship with God also demands times of explicit prayer, in which the relationship becomes an intense dialogue, involving every dimension of the person. 'The Lord's Day' is the day of this relationship par excellence when men and women raise their song to God and be-

## come the voice of all creation." (DD, 15)

As pastor, it is my responsibility to make it possible for you to have opportunities to attend Mass on **Sunday. It's also important that if we offer Mass, we** also make it possible for you to park! I recently realized that multiple groups met on Sunday morning, making parking a challenge, particularly because three Protestant churches within a block or two of us have their service at 10 a.m., and a fourth at 9:30 a.m.

For this reason, I am instituting a policy that forbids groups to meet on Sundays during our Mass times. I am grateful to those groups that have accepted this inconvenient change and understood my reasons. We will also have a special Mass schedule on Easter Sunday that gives more time between Masses — especially when we have two at the same time! I realize that I make exceptions to this rule for parish-wide activities, like the Fiesta and the Campaign Kickoff/St. Dominic celebration August 13, but I will try to limit those.

The Sabbath commemorates God's "rest" from the act of creation. St. John Paul II said this "rest" "is a 'contemplative' gaze which does not look to new accomplishments but enjoys the beauty of what has already been achieved." (DD, II) I encourage you to reclaim Sunday as a day for family and rest, and as a time to contemplate the good things God has done for you, and the good He has done through you.

Introducing Fr. Cassian Lewinski, OP Fr. Cassian has served in campus ministries and parishes, and also is remembered as a much-loved novice master in the Western Province. Fr. Cassian was the Director of the University of Utah Newman Center when Fr. Michael Fones served as his associate pastor. He was a member of the Western Dominican community in Berkeley, CA, that the friars are leaving, and is beginning his retirement with us. Here's what he says about himself. "I love to read so hope to start a novel-reading book — not religious novels - all kinds of novels. Otherwise, it's just me, my clothes and my memories and some good stories that I can use in an occasional homily. Otherwise I am a complete bore.

What role did Mary play in larger theological reflections about her Son and the nature of salvation? When did Christians first begin to seek her intercession? Finally, an attempt will be made to see how this vision can add to our own understanding of Our Lady, and our own devotion to her, especially in the context of the Dominican tradition.

No, si tomamos las palabras de Jesús sobre "ser acogedores" de corazón. Los muchos retos y bendiciones que hoy nos ofrecen Eliseo, Pablo, y Jesús deben ser causa de regocijo, y debemos acogerlos de corazón en nuestras vidas. Y, como el gran regalo que son, deben ser disfrutados y compartidos generosamente con los demás.

La lectura de hoy tomada de la carta a los romanos fue seleccionada en los comienzos de la vida litúrgica de la Iglesia como instrucción apostólica que debían recibir los candidatos al bautismo durante la Vigilia de Pascua. No sólo estábamos muertos, sino enterrados; pero no enterrados para siempre, sino resucitados a la vida eterna en Cristo.
