

Alejandro has a B.A. in Philosophy, a Master's of Divinity, an MA in Theology from the Dominican School of Philosophy and Theology and a Ph.D. from Marquette University in Theology Ethics, focusing on Political Theology and Mass Communication/Media Studies concentrating on Film. He has served as the dean of the faculty of social sciences at the Pontifical University of St. Thomas Aquinas (The Angelicum) in Rome.
