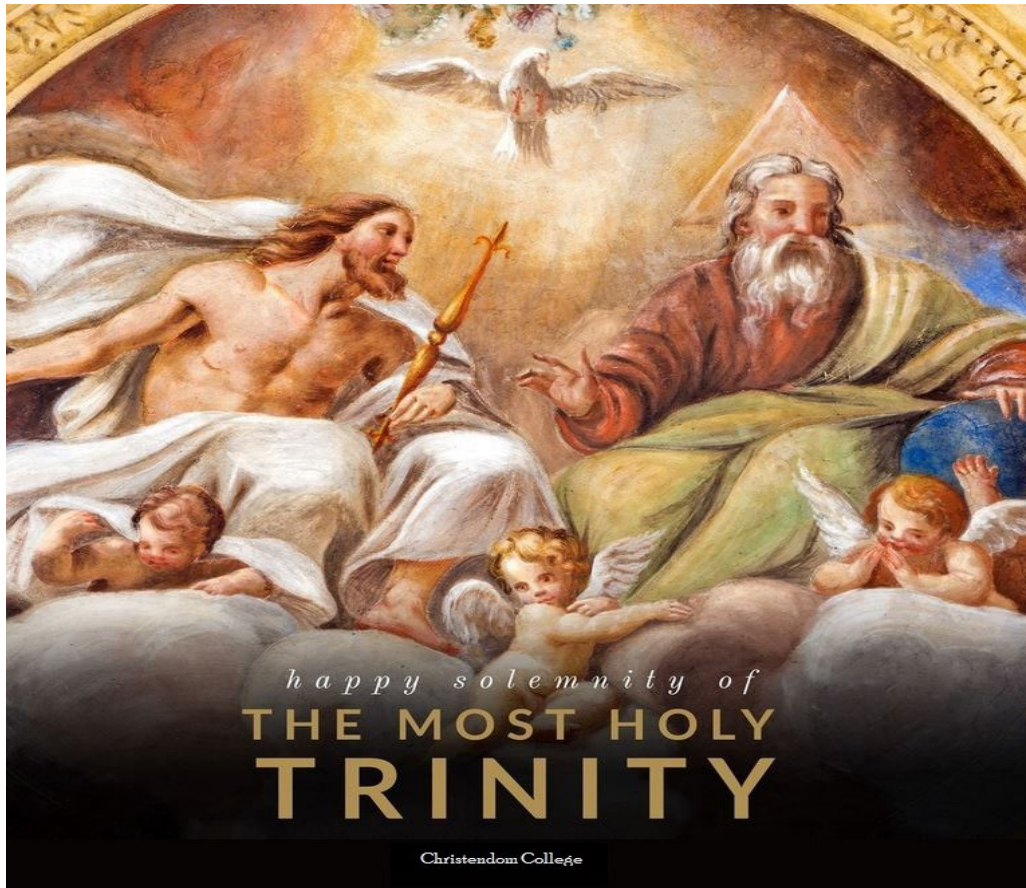

PASTOR'S CORNER

In the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. We say this prayer so many times. We make the sign of the cross with holy water as we enter a church. We begin Mass and all our prayer sessions with this prayer. This is the Trinity: three persons, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, three persons in one God.

We try so hard to understand how God can be Three Persons at one time. Yes, there is one God, and this God is our Father. This God is also the Father's Son, and God the Holy Spirit is the love that flows between the Father and the Son. "The Father is that which the Son is, the Son that which the Father is, the Father and the Son that which the Holy Spirit is, i.e., by nature one God." (*Catechism of the Catholic Church* #253).

St. Patrick came up with a way to help the pagans of Ireland understand the Trinity. The three-leaf clover, also known as a shamrock, has been considered the unofficial national flower of Ireland for centuries. Irish legend says that Saint Patrick used it as an educational symbol to explain the Holy Trinity as he converted the Irish to Christianity in the fourth century. It has three leaves that are part of one leaf.



It is OK if we do not fully understand the Trinity. That's what makes it a mystery: it can only be known through God's Revelation. Sure, we can learn about the Trinity through his work in creation and in Scripture, but ultimately, it is something that we cannot understand through human reason alone. It can only be revealed by God through faith. The mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the source of all the mysteries of our faith. And with our faith, we profess our belief in the Trinity every time we profess our faith in the Nicene Creed. In the Name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Three persons in one God. Happy Trinity Feast Day. AMEN.

LA ESQUINA DEL PASTOR

En el nombre del Padre, del Hijo y del Espíritu Santo. Decimos esta oración tantas veces. Hacemos la señal de la cruz con agua bendita cuando entramos en una iglesia. Comenzamos la Misa y todas nuestras sesiones de oración con esta oración. Esta es la Trinidad: tres personas, Padre, Hijo y Espíritu Santo, tres personas en un solo Dios.

Nos esforzamos tanto por entender cómo Dios puede ser Tres Personas a la vez. Sí, hay un Dios, y este Dios es nuestro Padre. Este Dios es también el Hijo del Padre, y Dios el Espíritu Santo es el amor que fluye entre el Padre y el Hijo. "El Padre es lo que es el Hijo, el Hijo lo que es el Padre, el Padre y el Hijo lo que es el Espíritu Santo, es decir, por naturaleza un Dios". (Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica #253).

A San Patricio se le ocurrió una manera de ayudar a los paganos de Irlanda a entender la Trinidad. El trébol de tres hojas, también conocido como trébol, ha sido considerado la flor nacional no oficial de Irlanda durante siglos. La leyenda irlandesa dice que San Patricio lo usó como un símbolo educativo para explicar la Santísima Trinidad cuando convirtió a los irlandeses al cristianismo en el siglo IV. Tiene tres hojas que forman parte de una hoja.



Está bien si no entendemos completamente la Trinidad. Eso es lo que lo convierte en un misterio: solo puede ser conocido a través de la Revelación de Dios. Claro, podemos aprender acerca de la Trinidad a través de su obra en la creación y en las Escrituras, pero en última instancia, es algo que no podemos entender solo a través de la razón humana. Sólo puede ser revelado por Dios a través de la fe. El misterio de la Santísima Trinidad es la fuente de todos los misterios de nuestra fe. Y con nuestra fe, profesamos nuestra creencia en la Trinidad cada vez que profesamos nuestra fe en el Credo de Nicea. En el Nombre del Padre, del Hijo y del Espíritu Santo. Tres personas en un solo Dios. Feliz fiesta de la Trinidad. AMÉN.

Journey to Catholic Shrines East Coast, USA and Eastern Canada

Experience this journey to the Catholic Shrines in upstate New York, Boston, Philadelphia and Maryland, as well as Montreal and Quebec in Canada. This 10-day pilgrimage that will start from Los Angeles will be on **September 25 to October 4, 2023**. Among the shrines that will be visited are: the world’s biggest shrine dedicated to Jesus’ grandmother called The Shrine of St. Anne de Beupre (Quebec), Our Lady of Victory Basilica (New York), The National Shrine of Divine Mercy (Massachusetts), and The National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception (Washington, D.C).

Visit the magnificent sites of Niagara Falls (Canadian side), Thousand Island (Toronto), and White Mountain (Boston).

The cost of the tour is **\$2,650** per person based on double occupancy. The price includes round-trip airfare from LA, accommodations in 3-4star hotels, daily breakfast and dinner, land transportation by deluxe motor coach, professional tour manager, and Holy Mass as indicated in the itinerary. Gratuity for tour director and bus driver included but not fees for boat rides tours of the shrines, and tips for room maids and hotel servers. **Valid passport is required.**
