

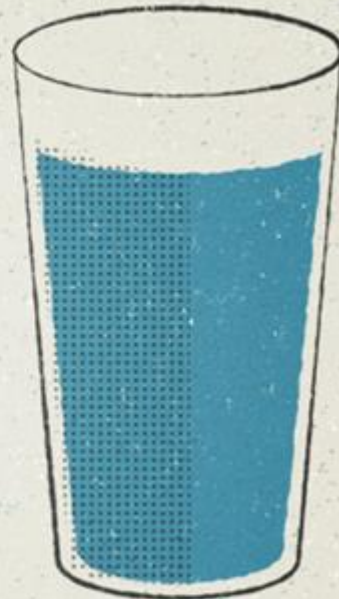

### ¿Por qué mantenerse alejado?



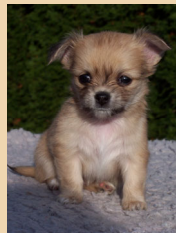

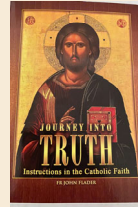

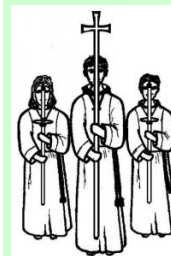


Take a journey into truth about God, the Universe, and Ourselves
