PASTOR'S CORNER

When I was a toddler, my family lived in the small town of Tribes Hill, New York, on the Mohawk River, 20 miles from Schenectady and 40 miles from Albany. Visiting our old home-
stead a few years ago, I discovered that I had lived just 4 miles from Auriesville, on the south side of the Mohawk River, the birthplace of St. Kateri Tekakwitha and current site of a huge property where her shrine is today.



St. Kateri was born in 1656 to a Mohawk chief and a Christian Algonquin mother, who had been assimilated into the Mohawk tribe. My small town of Tribes Hill gets its name from the Mohawk Tribe that originated near there.

When a French-led raiding party destroyed the Mohawk settlements on the south side of the river; Kateri's family and other Mohawk survivors moved to the north side of the river and built the fortified settlement. In accordance with custom, she was engaged to a young boy at about the age of thirteen; however, she wished to remain unmarried. "I can have no spouse but Jesus," she later told her confessor.

At age eighteen, she was baptized in the Catholic faith by Fr. Jacques de Lamberville, the Jesuit priest, missionary to the Mohawk Tribe. Kateri is the Mohawk form of her baptismal name, Catherine, which she chose in honor of Saint Catherine of Siena, O.P. After relocating to the Mission of Saint Francis Xavier, a Catholic Native settlement near what is now Montreal, Canada. Kateri's health failed, and she died on April 17, 1680, at the age of 23. Her feast day is this Friday, July 14.

LA ESQUINA DEL PASTOR

Cuando era un niño pequeño, mi familia vivía en la pequeña ciudad de Tribes Hill, Nueva York, en el río Mohawk, a 20 millas de Schenectady y 40 millas de Albany. Al visitar nuestra antigua granja hace unos años, descubrí que había vivido a solo 4 millas de Auriesville, en el lado sur del río Mohawk, el lugar de nacimiento de Santa Kateri Tekakwitha y el sitio actual de una enorme propiedad donde hoy se encuentra su santuario.



Sta. Kateri nació en 1656 de un jefe mohawk y una madre cristiana algonquina, que había sido asimilada en la tribu mohawk. Mi pequeña ciudad de Tribes Hill recibe su nombre de la tribu Mohawk que se originó cerca de allí.

Cuando un grupo de asalto liderado por Francia destruyó los asentamientos mohawk en el lado sur del río; la familia de Kateri y otros sobrevivientes Mohawk se mudaron al lado norte del río y construyeron el asentamiento fortificado. De acuerdo con la costumbre, se comprometió con un niño a la edad de trece años; sin embargo, ella deseaba permanecer soltera. "No puedo tener más esposo que Jesús", le dijo más tarde a su confesor.

A los dieciocho años, fue bautizada en la fe católica por el P. Jacques de Lamberville, el sacerdote jesuita, misionero de la tribu Mohawk. Kateri es la forma Mohawk de su nombre bautismal, Catherine, que eligió en honor de Santa Catalina de Siena, O.P. Después de mudarse a la Misión de San Francisco Javier, un asentamiento nativo católico cerca de lo que hoy es Montreal, Canadá. La salud de Kateri decayó, y murió el 17 de abril de 1680, a la edad de 23 años. Su fiesta es este viernes 14 de julio.

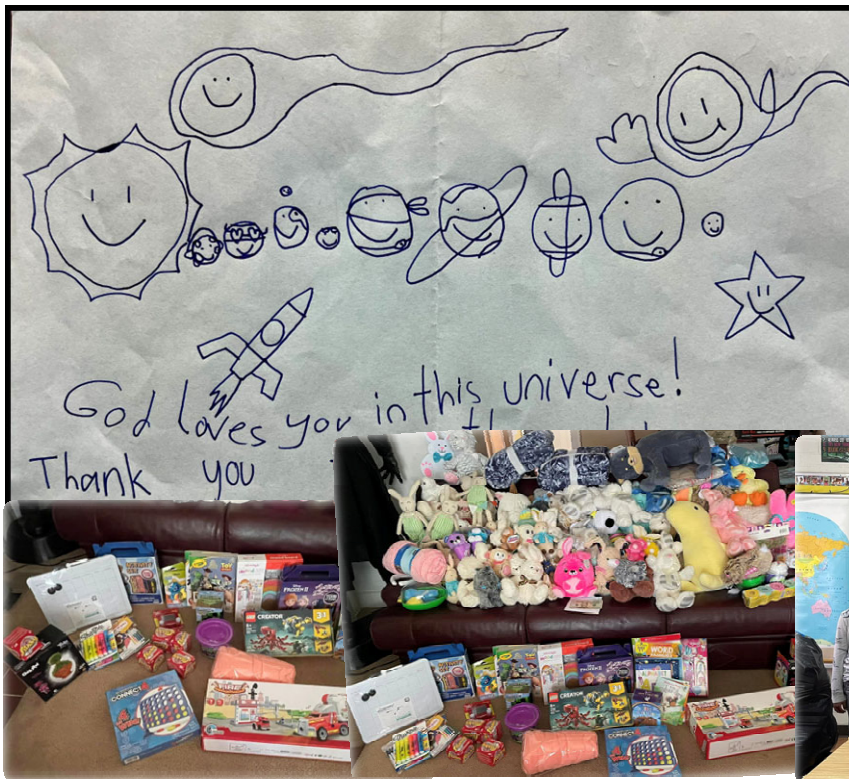
