Pastor's Corner

On Labor Day, Monday, September 2, we celebrate all who labor for the good of all in society. Regardless of the work, it all contributes to our way of life and every job needs to be honored and the person in those jobs be respected and appreciated for the work accomplished. In the work we do, we are participating in God's ongoing creation.

When I spent one summer in hospital chaplaincy years ago, I came to know the doctors, nurses, orderlies, counselors, cafeteria workers, and maintenance workers. I enjoyed my interaction with all of them at the hospital. Most were not Catholic, but many started to come to me for guidance and advice. By respecting them all, they came to respect me. No job at the hospital could be eliminated without causing the hospital to stop functioning.



Catholic social teaching also cares for the rights of those who work, and we need to safeguard these rights by respect the human dignity that God has created us to have and enjoy. To understand this fully, we have to enter into a more intimate relationship with our Jesus and not just be as a 'social justice' Day person. It requires us to enter into that deeper spiritual relationship. Social justice is not political, it is spiritual, and this approach brings us closer to Jesus by recognizing the work He did, from helping His father in carpentry to completing His work of salvation on the Cross.

On Labor Day, we enjoy a day off because we all need a break and refreshment from daily labor but remember also the place of God in our labor.

La doctrina social católica también se preocupa por los derechos de los que trabajan, y debemos salvaguardar estos derechos respetando la dignidad humana para la que Dios nos ha creado y para que la disfrutemos. Para entender esto completamente, tenemos que entrar en una relación más íntima con nuestro Jesús y no ser solo como una persona de 'justicia social'. Requiere que entremos en esa relación espiritual más profunda. La justicia social no es política, es espiritual, y este enfoque nos acerca a Jesús al reconocer el trabajo que hizo, desde ayudar a su padre en la carpintería hasta completar su obra de salvación en la cruz.

En el Día del Trabajo, disfrutemos de un día libre porque todos necesitamos un descanso y refrescarnos del trabajo diario, pero también recordemos el lugar de Dios en nuestro trabajo.
