For the next few weeks I will try to give some options to explore these topics. Some are available right now, others are being planned for the near future.

Note that the first four most selected areas were the same for both English and Spanish-speaking parishioners, with helping the poor being the highest selected option.

Our St. Vincent de Paul Society volunteers respond directly to individuals who live in our parish and request help with food, lodging, transportation, or other necessities. These volunteers do great hands-on work, and would welcome more volunteers. We also serve simple bag lunches Monday-Friday from 11-1 to our hungry neighbors = both the homeless as well as elderly folks who need help making ends meet. You can help by making sandwiches, filling or handing out bags, even cleaning up afterwards.

On Fridays parishioners offer a hot meal to all who come to the parish hall from 5-6 p.m. We need volunteers to cook, clean, set up, serve, and just talk with our guests.

We Can Make a Difference 5th Grade Service Group

As you may know, St. Dominic School students participate in a fair number of service projects over the course of the school year. A few months ago, a couple of fifth grade girls approached Mrs. Diaz and asked if they could hold a bake sale. They hoped to raise money to buy toys for children in the hospital. They gathered a few other fifth grade classmates and coordinated with their parents to hold a nacho and bake sale. The sale raised well over \$300. The students were able to go online and purchase toys from Amazon.com, which were delivered to the school. In the meantime, they named their group **"We Can Make a Difference." The project culminated in late April when the group visited Shriners** Hospital in Pasadena in order to deliver toys to the children being treated there. They were able to meet patients, pass out toys, and had a tour of the facility.

While St. Dominic School students do a lot of service, this project was unusual in that it was entirely student driven. The idea was theirs alone from the beginning, not based on the suggestion or direction

of a teacher or parent. They organized the bake sale, purchased the toys, and most impressively, coordinated with the hospital to set up a date to visit. They never lacked motivation and were very persistent in seeing their project through to the end. They did a fantastic job and we are so proud to call them St. Dominic Saints!
