Pastor's corner

I wonder how many of you saw the opinion essay written by Catherine Price in the November 30 edition of the LA Times? She wrote about a 24-hour fast from cell phones, tablets and computers. She said that when she and her husband did this, it felt as though they unlocked a time-stretching superpower – it felt as though they had more time to talk, cook, clean, read, and do other things they really enjoy.

She quoted David Greenfield, a psychology professor at the University of Connecticut School of Medicine and founder of the Center for Internet and Technology Addiction. He said, "When we're on our devices, we lose the ability to mark the passage of time. This phenomenon is called dissociation, and virtually everyone experiences it to some extent when on screens." It's true for me, and that's why I am no longer on Facebook.

This Advent, when no adult seems to have enough time, try fasting from your phone. Start small – like at meals, or in the evening. Kids, too, need this, even more than adults. There are some other things you can do to make Advent a real preparation for Christmas. For example, I have special "Advent music" I only listen to during this season. I save the Christmas tunes for Christmas! If you send out Christmas cards, pray for each recipient before you sign and address the card. Sign up for a daily Advent reflection from FORMED.org or Matthew Kelly or Bishop Robert Barron to keep you focused on Scripture. Don't feel obligated to attend every Christmas party to which you're invited! Consider giving your *time* and *presence* to your loved ones, rather than presents. You'll have to ditch your cell phone for that - and so will they!

Approximately two-thirds of the parish membership has not made a pledge or donation to the Capital Campaign. I am very grateful for those who have made a sacrificial gift, and I urge those who have not participated to please join your fellow parishioners in this project. We have already spent an additional \$350,000 to repair the second floor roof, renovate the large room, and do seismic retrofitting.

We are required to have 60% of our goal in *cash* before the Archdiocese will allow us to get a "bridge" loan and begin the actual renovation. Currently we have \$539,000 in cash and need \$1.1 million in cash before we can get the loan. No construction will begin until we have the \$1.1 million. Of course, we also need another \$343,000 in pledges and donations to make our goal. The longer we wait, the greater the chances the costs will increase. Please help!

Support Our Capital Campaign

As we approach the end of the year, NOW is a great time to make tax-deductible charitable contributions. Currently we are at 82% of our goal of \$1.855 million dollars in terms of actual cash on hand and pledges. We need 60% of our total (\$1,113,000) in CASH before we can receive a "bridge" loan from the Archdiocese to begin the actual work on the second part of our rebuilding of the Community Center. We currently have \$535,400.85 in cash in our investment pool and savings account.

Two-thirds of our parishioners have not contributed to the capital campaign! We cannot complete our campaign without your participation. This is a project that will provide much-needed meeting space and space and resources for consistent evangelization programs that we need to help people meet Jesus and conform their lives to the Gospel.

Here are some tips regarding charitable giving from a couple of our parishioners who are involved in accounting and financial planning:

- 1. Contribute "APPRECIATED ASSETS", such as stocks or share in mutual funds. Provided you've OWNED the property for more than ONE year, you can deduct its FULL VALUE in most cases. NEITHER you or the charity has to pay tax on the appreciation.
- 2. DON'T donate property that has declined in value since you acquired it. The charity won't get to deduct the built in loss when it disposes of the asset.
- 3. Take advantage of a charitable tax break for IRA owners age 70 ½ or older. You can transfer up to \$100,000 PER YEAR from your traditional IRA DIRECTLY to charity. Such charitable transfers COUNT as part of your REQUIRED MINIMUM DISTRIBUTION. But unlike other payouts, these direct gifts are NOT included in your taxable income. The IRA-to-charity strategy can be a good way to get tax savings from charitable gifts for taxpayers NOT taking charitable write offs because of higher standard deductions.
- 4. DON'T waste the annual gift tax exclusion of \$15,000 each done without having to pay GIFT TAX or tap your lifetime estate & gift tax exemption of \$11,180,000 each person.
