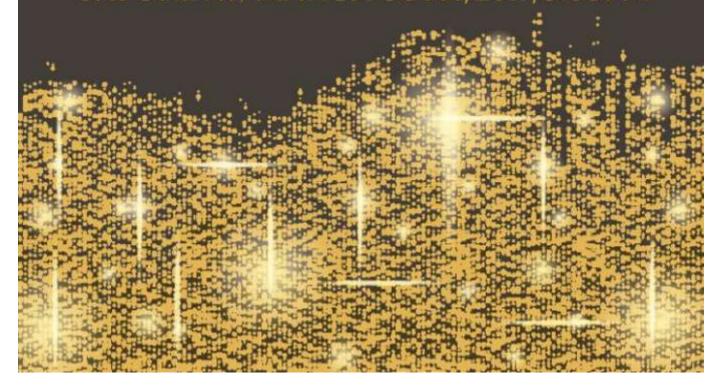

A Message from Fr. Roberto

What Kind of Shape Are You In?

For those of you who served in the military, that was probably the time you were in the best shape of your life, especially the first part of military service for new recruits called "boot camp." Well, we Catholics have something like boot camp each year; it is a chance to get into good spiritual shape, and it's called "Lent." During these 40 days of Lent each year, the Church challenges us to assess our relationship with God and ask ourselves "What kind of spiritual shape am I in?" In other words, we examine our lives to discover how our following of Christ is lacking and make the choice to change those areas of our lives.

So, here we are at almost the halfway point of Lent, and the question is, what kind of spiritual shape are you in at this time? Have you been able to keep your Lenten resolutions? Are you in good spiritual shape, are you in so-so shape, or are you totally out of it? Wherever we find ourselves



on that continuum, we can still use the remaining days of Lent to try to grow closer to God and to improve our spiritual shape, and the possibilities for doing that are endless. Fasting, prayer, and works of mercy are traditionally offered to us in the Church as ways of living Lent more intensely since these practices can help us to become more like Jesus. Lent is not so much about giving things up or doing extra things as **it is about changing our hearts, trying to be a better person, trying to be more like Jesus.** So, wherever you are on your Lenten journey, the Lord is calling you to move forward – don't give up!
