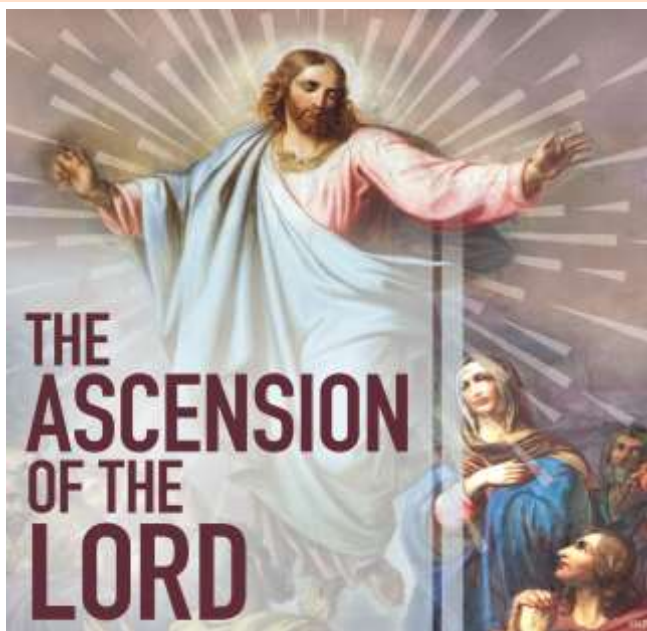

TENGA CUIDADO LOS ÚLTIMOS FRAUDES DE TEXTO DE LOS ESTAFADORES CIBERNÉTICOS ESTÁN DIRIGIDOS A LAS ESCUELAS Y PARROQUIAS DE LA ADLA



"Smishing" (SMS phishing) es un tipo de actividad fraudulenta que involucra el uso de SMS o mensajes de texto para engañar a las personas para que entreguen información personal o confidencial, y así, obtener su dinero de manera fraudulenta. Los perpetradores utilizan varias técnicas de ingeniería social para ganarse la confianza de una víctima y por lo general dan instrucciones específicas que, de ser seguidas, pueden resultar en una pérdida monetaria para la víctima.

- Tómese el tiempo para considerar sus acciones antes de responder mensajes de texto sospechosos.
- En caso de duda, llame al número telefónico de la parroquia, escuela u oficina administrativa de la que supuestamente proviene el texto, para verificar el mensaje de texto.
- Pregúntese si el remitente fuera genuino se comunicaría con usted a través de un mensaje de texto.

A Message from Fr. Roberto

As I mentioned last week during my announcement at the Masses, I have been here at St. Dominic's for three months now, and I want you all to know that I am very much enjoying my time here. I am happy to be your new pastor, and I am grateful for the very warm welcome I have received since I have been here. I am excited about what we can accomplish as a parish.

I am also grateful for all the work that has been done by the Dominicans and the parish staff through the years. One of the wise things done by Fr. Paul Scanlon was to buy the Masonic building on the corner of Caspar and Chickasaw with a vision of making it our parish Community Center. And then five years ago, Father Peter Rogers, who was pastor at that time, began a campaign to remodel that dilapidated building so we could begin to use it. Finally, Fr. Michael Fones, **our previous pastor, continued to promote Fr. Paul's vision and the campaign** during his time here.

So now it comes to me as your new pastor to finish this campaign. The good news is that, as of April 30, we have received \$873,847.04 in cash and \$771,698.96 in pledges; this is just about 90% of our goal of \$1,855,000. Congratulations! It is so good that you have raised that much money already. Now, the challenging news is that this campaign has been going on for almost five years. It has had ups and downs in those five years, and now it is time for us to finish it. We need less than \$210,000.00 more to do so.

So, I am asking all of you to help us as much as you can to finish the campaign. I am especially asking those of you who have not yet given to this campaign to do so. As I have said at every parish I have served as a priest: this is your parish! It is not my parish – I just got here, and I will be here for a while. Then I will leave and most of you will stay. It is that way for all of us Dominicans and even for the parish staff: we come and go, but you parishioners stay. **St. Dominic's is your parish and your spiritual home.** This is where many of you or your children or grandchildren receive Baptism, First Communion and Confirmation. It is where some of you or your loved ones get married or have their funerals. It is where you get fed spiritually each week or more often. Even in the short time I have been here, I have heard from so many of you how much you love this parish. Therefore, I invite you **to take responsibility to care for St. Dominic's and help it grow and prosper. Just as previous generations built the church, the school, the parish hall and the rectory, so now it comes to us to support St. Dominic's for future generations.**

This week, we have an insert in the bulletin with a list of all those who have given at least \$50 to the campaign. So far, there are about 560 names on that list. That is very good, but we are a parish of at least 2,000 people, so we still have a ways to go. I would ask each of you who has not yet given, to give at least \$50 in these next weeks – or to give more if you can – **as a sign of supporting your spiritual home here at St. Dominic's. Your name will then appear on the list of donors that will come out in subsequent weeks.**

For those of you who have already given to the campaign, I ask you to give more if you can so that we can finally terminate the campaign and the remodeling of the Community Center that needs to happen. We have so many groups and ministries here that we are always in need of more space.

You are invited to give cash, checks, stocks or whatever other means you have to donate and help us reach our goal. I am hoping we can complete the campaign by August so that we can begin the remodeling as soon as possible afterward and use the entire building for our many needs. Please be generous and please pray for the success of this important project for our parish. Thank you and God bless you.



**BEWARE CYBER SCAMMERS
LATEST TEXT SCAMS
TARGETING ADLA SCHOOLS
AND PARISHES**

"Smishing" (SMS phishing) is a type of fraudulent activity that involves using SMS or text messages to trick people into giving up personal information so that money can be fraudulently obtained. Perpetrators use various techniques to gain the trust of a victim and may provide specific instructions, which if followed, could result in monetary loss to the victim. Perpetrators may impersonate someone you know that is in some position of authority (a priest, teacher, manager, police, or government agency). **DO NOT BECOME A VICTIM.**

If you receive such texts do the following:

- Take time to consider your actions before responding to suspicious text messages.
- If in doubt, call the published main number of the parish, school or administrative office from whom the text claims to have been sent to authenticate the text message.
- Do not respond to the text message if you doubt its origin.

Un Mensaje de Padre Roberto

Como Padre Francis mencionó la semana pasada en su anuncio durante la Misa, he estado aquí en Sto. Domingo por tres meses y quiero que todos sepan que estoy disfrutando mucho mi tiempo aquí. Estoy feliz de ser su nuevo párroco, y estoy agradecido por la cálida bienvenida que he recibido desde que estoy aquí. Estoy entusiasmado con lo que podemos lograr como parroquia.

También estoy agradecido por todo el trabajo realizado por los dominicos y el equipo pastoral de la parroquia a través de los años. Una de las cosas sabias hechas por el P. Pablo Scanlon **era comprar el edificio masónico en** la esquina de Caspar y Chickasaw con la visión de convertirlo en nuestro centro comunitario parroquial. Y hace cinco años, el P. Peter Rogers, **que era párroco en ese momento, comenzó una campaña para remodelar ese** edificio en ruinas para que pudiéramos comenzar a usarlo. Finalmente, el P. Michael Fones, **nuestro párroco** anterior, continuó promoviendo a la visión de P. Pablo y la campaña durante su tiempo aquí.

Así que ahora me toca a mí como su nuevo párroco terminar esta campaña. La buena noticia es que, al 30 de abril, hemos recibido \$873,847,04 en efectivo y \$771,698,96 en promesas; esto es aproximadamente el 90% de nuestra meta de \$1,855,000. **¡Felicidades! Es tan bueno que ya hayamos recaudado tanto** dinero. Ahora, la desafiante noticia es que esta campaña ha estado ocurriendo durante casi cinco años. Ha tenido altibajos en esos cinco años, y ahora es el momento de que lo terminemos. Necesitamos menos de **\$210,000,00 más para hacerlo.**

Por lo tanto, les pido a todos que nos ayuden tanto como puedan para terminar la campaña. Les pido especialmente a aquellos de ustedes que aún no se han dedicado a esta campaña que lo hagan. Como he dicho en cada parroquia donde he servido como sacerdote: ¡esta es tu parroquia! No es mi parroquia – acabo de llegar y estaré aquí por un tiempo. Entonces me iré y la mayoría de ustedes se quedarán. Así es para todos nosotros los dominicos e incluso para el equipo pastoral de la parroquia: vamos y vinimos, pero ustedes se quedan. Santo Domingo es tu parroquia y tu hogar espiritual. **Aquí es donde muchos de ustedes, sus hijos o nietos reciben el** Bautismo, la Primera Comuni3n y la Confirmaci3n. Es donde algunos de ustedes o sus seres queridos se casan o tienen sus funerales. Es donde te alimentas espiritualmente cada semana o más a menudo. Incluso en el poco tiempo que llevo aquí, he escuchado de muchos de ustedes lo mucho que aman a esta parroquia. Por lo tanto, los invito a asumir la responsabilidad de cuidar a Santo Domingo y ayudarlo a crecer y a prosperar. Así como las generaciones anteriores construyeron la iglesia, la escuela, el salón parroquial y la rectoría, ahora nos toca apoyar a Santo Domingo para las generaciones futuras.

Esta semana, tenemos una inserci3n en el boletín con una lista de todos los que han donado al menos \$50 a la campaña. Hasta ahora, hay alrededor de 560 nombres en esa lista. Eso es muy bueno, pero somos una parroquia de al menos 2,000 personas, por lo que todavía tenemos mucho camino por recorrer. Pido a cada uno de ustedes que aún no han dado, que den al menos \$50 en estas próximas semanas – o que den más si pueden – como una seña de apoyo a su hogar espiritual aquí en Sto. Domingo. Su nombre aparecerá en la lista de donantes que saldrá en las siguientes semanas.

Para aquellos de ustedes que ya han donado a la campaña, les pido que den más si pueden para que finalmente podamos terminar la campaña y la remodelaci3n del Centro Comunitario que debe suceder. Tenemos tantos grupos y ministerios aquí que siempre necesitamos más espacio.

Te invitamos a dar efectivo, cheques, acciones o cualquier otro medio que tengas para donar y ayudarnos a alcanzar nuestra meta. Espero que podamos completar la campaña en agosto para poder comenzar la remodelaci3n tan pronto como sea posible y usar todo el edificio para todas nuestras necesidades. DID YOU KNOW?

If you hear concerns about boundaries, speak up. Parents can learn a lot about their children, and their children's friends, simply by keeping conversations going whenever possible — after school carpool, snack time, field trips, etc. Pay attention to any conversations that leave you feeling unsettled, and know when it's important for you to speak up. For example, a child's friend may tell you she doesn't like her new history teacher, or he makes her feel uncomfortable. Even if you don't know the teacher personally, it is well worth communicating the concerns the child has to the school. It can be easier to pick up on levels of discomfort or unease in children rather than watching the adult in question.
