A Message from Fr. Roberto

Pentecost – Are We Grown Ups or Little Kids?

The pictures to the right and left remind me of some Catholics I know who are physically adults but spiritually still little kids because their faith is immature. They are spiritual little girls walking **around in high heel shoes or spiritual little boys wearing a man's suit!** The reason we adults have adult-sized bodies is because we have nourished them and stimulated their growth.

The question is, have we nourished our spirits in a similar manner? For example, besides coming to Mass, when was the last time you did something to nurture your faith? When was the last time you read a good book or magazine or something on the Internet or went on a retreat or attended a workshop or a class to deepen your Catholic faith? Do you pray and read the Bible regularly to stimulate your spiritual growth?

On one hand, Jesus wants us to be like children; he said: *“Amen, I say to you, whoever does not accept the kingdom of God like a child will not enter it” (Mark 10:15).*

This reminds us that we have to be like children in terms of trusting and depending on God, and in our openness and innocence. In other words, Jesus is challenging us to be childlike; however, he does not want us to be childish, i.e., immature in our faith – there is a big difference between those two words!

It was the Holy Spirit who on Pentecost changed the apostles of Jesus from having a childish and immature faith based on ego and fear to an adult faith based on love and courage. Just read the book of the Acts of the Apostles to see how different the apostles were before and after Pentecost – it was like night and day!

So, my brothers and sisters, what kind of faith do you and I have – a juvenile faith or one that is mature? If we still have the same level of faith we did five, ten or twenty years ago

or when we were children, something is wrong because it means we have not grown spiritually.

Especially on this feast of Pentecost, God is challenging us to grow up and be spiritual adults not children; to be childlike not childish; to have a mature Catholic Christian faith. What does a mature Catholic faith look like? It means putting God and our faith first in our lives, nurturing our spiritual lives through prayer, reading the Bible and receiving the sacraments regularly, **and sharing our gifts for God's glory and for the good of others.** If we are not doing something in each of these areas, our faith is not as mature as it should be.

St. Paul said: *“When I was a child, I used to talk as a child, think as a child, reason as a child; when I became a man, I put aside childish things” (1 Corinthians 13:11).* If we are just going through the motions in our faith, fitting God into our lives only when we have some extra time or need something, then it is time for us to grow up spiritually and be the mature man or woman of God he calls us to be.

Pentecostés – ¿Somos Adultos o Niños?

Estas fotos a la derecha y la izquierda me recuerdan de algunos católicos que conozco que son físicamente adultos pero espiritualmente todavía son niños porque su fe es inmadura. ¡Ellas son niñas espirituales caminando en los zapatos de tacón alto o son niños espirituales vistiéndose en un traje de hombre! La razón por la que los adultos tenemos un cuerpo de tamaño adulto es porque los hemos nutrido y estimulado su crecimiento.

La pregunta es, ¿hemos alimentado nuestro espíritu de manera semejante? Por ejemplo, aparte de venir a Misa, ¿cuándo fue la última vez que hiciste algo para alimentar tu fe? ¿Cuándo fue la última vez que leíste un buen libro o una revista o algo en el Internet o que fuiste a un retiro o asististe a un taller o a una clase para profundizar tu fe católica? ¿Oras y lees la Biblia con regularidad para estimular tu crecimiento espiritual?

Por un lado, Jesús quiere que seamos como niños; él dijo: *"En verdad les digo: el que no reciba el Reino de Dios como un niño, no entrará en él"* (Marcos 10,15). Esto nos recuerda que debemos ser como niños en cuanto a confiar y depender de Dios, y en cuanto nuestra apertura e inocencia. Sin embargo, él no quiere que seamos infantiles, es decir, inmaduros – en cuanto nuestra fe ¡Hay

una gran diferencia entre esas dos cosas!

Fue el Espíritu Santo, quien en Pentecostés cambió los apóstoles de Jesús de tener una fe infantil e inmadura basada en el egoísmo y el miedo en una fe adulta basada en el amor y el coraje. Simplemente lee el libro de los Hechos de los Apóstoles para ver cómo eran diferentes los apóstoles antes y después de Pentecostés – ¡fue una diferencia increíble!

Por lo tanto, mis hermanos y hermanas, ¿qué tipo de fe tenemos tú y yo – una fe inmadura o una que está madura? Si todavía tenemos el mismo nivel de fe que teníamos cinco, diez o veinte años atrás o cuando éramos niños, algo está mal porque significa que no hemos crecido espiritualmente. Especialmente en esta fiesta de Pentecostés, Dios nos desafía a crecer y ser adultos espirituales no unos niños; a ser inocentes como niños pero no infantiles en nuestra fe; a tener una fe cristiana católica madura. ¿Cómo es una fe católica madura? Significa poner a Dios y a nuestra fe en primer lugar en nuestras vidas, alimentar nuestras vidas espirituales a través de orar, leer la Biblia y recibir los sacramentos regularmente, y compartir nuestros dones para la gloria de Dios y para el bien de los demás. Si no estamos haciendo algo en cada una de estas áreas, nuestra fe no es tan madura como debería ser.

San Pablo dijo: *"Cuando yo era un niño, solía hablar como niño, pensaba como niño, razonaba como niño; mas cuando ya fui hombre, dejé de lado las cosas de niño"* (1 Corintios 13,11). Si solo estamos cumpliendo con las obligaciones de nuestra fe sin ganas, o simplemente acomodando a Dios en nuestro horario solo cuando tenemos tiempo o cuando necesitamos algo, entonces es hora de que crezcamos espiritualmente y seamos los maduros hombres y mujeres de Dios que él nos llama a ser.
