# Thank you for your leadership in defeating SB 360!

Thank you for taking a stand for religious freedom. Thank you for raising your voice to protect the sacredness of the Sacrament of Confession. Archbishop José Gomez has written a statement proclaiming that the good work by California Catholics "is a sign of the great faith and vitality of our Catholic community and the importance of confession to our religious identity and practice."

SB 360, the bill proposed in the California Legislature, would have denied the right to confidential confessions to priests and tens of thousands of Catholics who work with priests in parishes and other Church agencies and ministries. This posed a serious threat to the religious liberty of Catholics in California and attempted to create a dangerous precedent of legislative overreach into the practice of religion. Thanks to the dedication of the Catholic faithful in California, letting our voices be heard through 140,000 signed letters and almost 17,000 emails to legislators from the Archdiocese of Los Angeles alone, the bill lacked enough support to pass out of committee.

This process confirms the importance of the faith community in public discourse and in the political process. United in purpose, people of faith can make a great impact for good in our legislative process. In the coming weeks and months, the Archdiocesan Office of Life, Justice and Peace will be offering parish workshops on Catholic Social Teaching, and Catholic Engagement in Voting and Politics.

St. Dominic – Part Three: He Encounters the Albigensian Heresy.

I am continuing my series of messages about St. Dominic as we prepare to celebrate his feast on

the weekend of August 3-4. St. Dominic was ordained a priest around the year 1194, when he was in his early 20's. In 1203, as a young priest, Dominic was asked by his bishop to accompany him on a trip to the distant kingdom of Denmark. On their way they met an innkeeper in Toulouse in southern France who had left Catholicism and embraced the Cathar or Albigensian heresy.

This heresy had its roots in the ancient beliefs of Gnosticism and Manichaeism. The Albigensians believed in two antagonistic gods: one was the god of the Old Testament of the Bible who was the god of evil; the other was the god of the New Testament, the god of goodness. Human souls were angels who had fallen into matter, and all matter – including the human body – was evil because it was under the domination of the god of evil. Salvation meant delivering oneself from the body and from all matter; therefore, Christ was not the redeemer but merely a teacher. His death and resurrection were just an illusion as was his very body.

In any event, Dominic conversed throughout the night with the Albigensian innkeeper about the fallacy of these heretical beliefs, and by dawn convinced him to return to the Catholic faith. This was most likely the first face-to-face encounter that the young Dominic experienced with this heresy; it would be just the first of many.


The heresy of Albigensianism was so deeply rooted throughout southern France that the current pope, Pope Innocent III, had earlier commissioned a handful of special papal representatives or legates to combat it. However, even after two years of strenuous efforts, these papal preachers had had almost no effect, and they were ready to give up the mission when Bishop Diego and Dominic ran into them. So, Bishop Diego offered them a revolutionary and inspirational idea: "use a nail to drive out a nail." That is, beat the Albigensians at their own game by being poorer, simpler, more prayerful and better preachers than the heretics.

Dominic eagerly embraced Bishop Diego's vision, so, after getting permission from the pope, they both decided to join the papal legates in their mission. To lead by example, they decided to live like the first apostles: itinerant, possessing nothing (except a few books) and begging for their daily needs for the sake of preaching the true Gospel of Jesus. This was the foundational vision and experience which would lead St. Dominic to found the Order of Preachers...*To be continued*...

#### Un Mensaje de Padre Roberto

Concurso de Bandera de Bienvenida

Como saben muchos de ustedes, el consejo pastoral y el equipo pastoral de nuestra parroquia trabajaron muy diligentemente con el P. Miguel Fones para establecer un plan pastoral parroquial para los próximos años. Como resultado, decidieron enfocarse en tres áreas en el futuro inmediato, y quiero apoyar su decisión al comenzar mi tiempo aquí. Las tres áreas de enfoque que eligieron fueron la hospitalidad, la evangelización familiar y el servicio, por lo que el consejo pastoral, el equipo de la parroquia y yo propondremos algunas ideas en los próximos meses para enfatizar estas tres áreas en Sto. Domingo.

En cuanto la hospitalidad, una idea que tenemos es colocar banderas de bienvenida afuera de las instalaciones parroquiales para expresar nuestra hospitalidad a todos nuestros visitantes, y nos gustaría pedirles a ustedes, nuestros feligreses, su ayuda para diseñar las banderas. Por lo tanto, nos gustaría tener un concurso de diseño de banderas de bienvenida abierto a todos los feligreses. 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Sto. Domingo convirtiendo a los herejes. Los perros moteados al fondo de la imagen simbolizan a los dominicos luchando contra los lobos (los herejes). Sto. Domingo – Parte Tres: Se Enfrenta con la Herejía Cátara

Continúo con mi serie de mensajes sobre Santo Domingo mientras nos preparamos para celebrar su fiesta el fin de semana del 3 y 4 de agosto.

Santo Domingo fue ordenado sacerdote alrededor del año 1194, cuando estaba en sus tempranos 20 años. En 1203, como un joven sacerdote, su obispo le pidió a Domingo que lo acompañara en un viaje al lejano reino de Dinamarca. En el camino, conocieron a un mesonero en Tolosa en el sur de Francia que profesaba la herejía del Catarismo.

Esta herejía tuvo sus raíces en las creencias ancianas del Gnosticismo y el Maniqueísmo. Los Cátaros creían en dos dioses antagonistas: uno era el dios del Antiguo Testamento de la Biblia quien era el dios del mal; el otro era el dios del Nuevo Testamento, el dios del bien. Las almas humanas eran ángeles que habían caído en la materia, y toda materia – inclusive el cuerpo humano – era mal porque estaba bajo el dominio del dios del mal. La salvación consistía en salvarse del cuerpo y de toda materia; por eso, Cristo no era el redentor sino simplemente un maestro. Su muerte y resurrección eran puras ilusiones como era su cuerpo.

De todos modos, Sto. Domingo platicó con el mesonero cátaro por toda la noche indicándole los errores del Catarismo, y para el amanecer lo había con-

vencido a que regresara a su fe católica. Esto era, probablemente, el primer encuentro que el joven santo había tenido con esta herejía; sería el primero de muchos.

La herejía del Catarismo era tan arraigada por todo el sur de Francia que el papa actual, el Papa Inocente III, antes había comisionado a unos representantes papales especiales para combatirla. Sin embargo, aun después de dos años de tremendos esfuerzos, esto predicadores papales no habían tenido nada de éxito, y estaban a punto de terminar la misión cuando el Obispo Diego y Sto. Domingo los encontraron. Entonces, Diego les ofreció **una idea revolucionaria e inspiradora: "utiliza un clavo para sacar un clavo." En otras palabras, vencer a los Cáta**ros utilizando sus propias cualidades positivas por ser más pobres, sencillos, contemplativos y mejores predicadores que ellos.

Sto. Domingo estaba totalmente en favor de esta visión de Diego; entonces, después de recibir el permiso del Papa, los dos decidieron unirse con los delegados papales en su misión. Poniendo el ejemplo, empezaron a vivir como los primeros apóstoles: itinerantes, poseyendo nada (aparte de unos libros) y mendigando sus necesidades cotidianas con el fin de predicar el verdadero Evangelio de Jesús. Ésta era la visión y la experiencia fundamental que **inspiraría a Sto. Domingo a fundar la Orden de Predicadores (los Dominicos)...***Continuará...*
