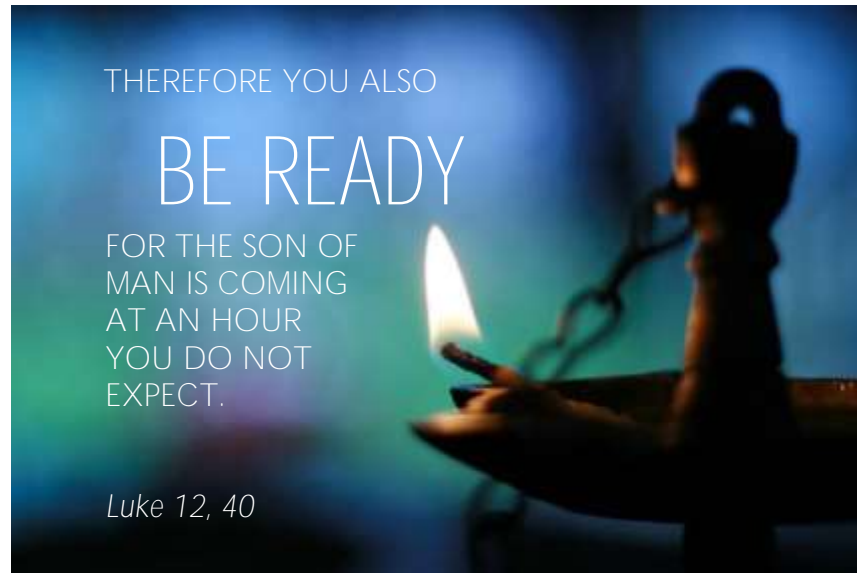

Do you wonder what we do with your donations? The Vincentians and associates bring hope, joy and a full belly. In July we sent 10 low income children to Circle V Ranch in Santa Barbara for a glorious week of swimming, hiking and crafts.

Every month we hand out an average of 30 sack lunches a day. We have had days when 50 people have shown up! Our associates prepare these lunches Monday through Friday between the hours of 11:00 a.m. and 1:30 p.m. in the kitchen and hand them out at the back door of the hall.

We host the HOPE dinner Friday night between 5:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. This is a sit down dinner prepared by hand by various associates. Our guests tend to be people on fixed incomes so we seat 40 at the beginning of the month 70 on the last Friday of a month.

In addition to our food programs our Vincentians make home visits upon request. We assess the need and make referrals to the appropriate agency.

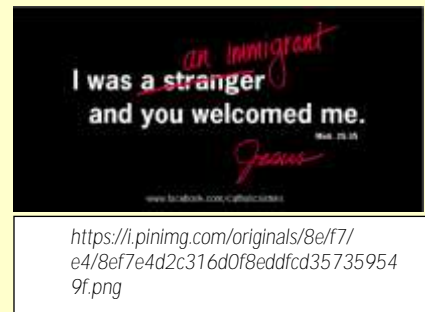
Dominicans Looking for Sunday Cook

Helpful Information for Immigrants

Archbishop José H. Gomez urges Americans to remember that they are a nation made great by immigration. He reminds Catholics that all immigrants, belong to God's family. He has placed the resources of the local Church at the service of these people who are most in need. The Archbishop is calling for immediate and comprehensive immigration reform. He emphasizes three basic principles as the foundation for reform:

1. Every immigrant is a human person, a child of God.
2. We must keep families together.
3. Our nation should have secure borders and immigration laws that are just, realistic, and consistently and compassionately enforced.

Town Hall Meeting Items for Discussion

All parishioners are invited to our parish town hall meeting next **Saturday, August 17th in the Fr. Scanlon Community Center. We invite you to come to Mass at 8 a.m. if possible and then join us for a continental style breakfast. The meeting will be from 9:00 to 11:30 a.m.** The parish staff, pastoral council and I have come up with some ideas that we would like to share with you in regards to providing a greater sense of hospitality at St. Dominic's as well as the celebration of our parish's 100th anniversary in 2021. In order to give you time to think about the issues we will present, here are some of the ideas we will be discussing:

1. Banners around campus welcoming people in English, Tagalog and Spanish;
2. Maps of our facilities mounted around campus;
3. Engage congregation with music before weekend Masses begin (except Sunday 7:30 a.m. Mass);
4. Welcome visitors at beginning of each weekend Mass (except Sunday 7:30 a.m. Mass);
5. Have a monthly blessing for wedding anniversaries at end of weekend Masses;
6. Establish a Welcome Center on Sundays in front of church with a coffee cart, parish information, etc.
7. Live stream Sunday Mass online for the homebound;
8. Provide care for children during Sunday Masses for newborns to six-year-olds;
9. Provide Children's Liturgy of the Word during Sunday Masses for seven-year-olds and above;
10. In order to provide more time during our weekend Masses to do some of the above activities, and in order to reduce the traffic and stress in our parking lot between Masses, we are considering changing our Sunday Mass schedule as follows: 7:30, 9:00, 11:00 a.m., 1:00 (Spanish), 5:00 p.m.
11. Hire part-time Coordinator of Communications to enhance our outreach via social media, webpage, bulletin, etc.

Please come prepared to listen and offer feedback to us regarding these and other ideas we will be presenting.

**Journey to Catholic Shrines
