DID YOU KNOW?

The Archdiocese is participating in an Independent Compensation Program for Victim-Survivors of Sexual Abuse of Minors by Priests. The Archdiocese of Los Angeles, along with five other dioceses in California, is participating in an independent program to offer persons who were victims of abuse as minors by diocesan priests, access to compensation as well as access to counseling services if they chose. Those harmed many years ago and barred from filing lawsuits because of civil statutes of limitations will be eligible to make claims under the Independent Compensation Program for Victim-Survivors of Sexual Abuse of Minors by Priests. The Archdiocese's participation in the program is part of a long-standing commitment to supporting and compensating victims of abuse, the protection of children and the vulnerable, and the prevention of abuse and misconduct in Catholic parishes, schools and ministries. Nationally recognized mediators and private compensation program administrators, Kenneth R. Feinberg and Camille S. Biros will administer the program. Funding for the program in our Archdiocese will come from self-insured reserves, monies set aside for this purpose. We pray that this new program might provide another avenue toward healing and hope. A Message from Fr. Roberto

The World Mission Rosary

October is the month of the rosary and also the month of world missions in our Catholic Church. So, it is an appropriate time to use the World Mission Rosary. This special rosary was envisioned by Archbishop Fulton John Sheen, then the national director of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith, in 1951. He made the request on a radio show that his listeners **“Embrace the world in prayer.” To do so he introduced this Rosary.** Its uniqueness is in the five colors represented in each of the decades. Color symbolism in a rosary is a gentle reminder on which to focus our prayers.

This rosary honors the work of mission, our call to be missionaries, and world unity and peace **through its special emphasis on each of the Earth's regions, where prayers** are needed for all people who live and play and pray just like each of us! Each region is represented by a different color, it is not only a beautiful rosary, but rich in symbolism. The colors/areas of the Mission Rosary include:

Green – for the forests and grasslands of Africa;

Red – calling to mind the fire of faith that brought missionaries to the Americas (US, Canada, Latin America and Native Americans);

White – symbolizing Europe, the home of the Holy Father;

Blue – for the ocean surrounding the Islands of the Pacific (Australia/Oceania);

Yellow – symbolizing the morning light of the East and **“beginning of civilization” for Asia/Middle East;**

These colors do not need to go in any particular order in the making of the Rosary.

The Mission Rosary can be prayed in the same way that you would pray any other rosary, be that in a group, with your family or individually. As you pray the Mission Rosary, you may pray whichever mysteries you choose to pray at the time and their corresponding prayers for each decade. Simply **keep in mind the area and all people of the world that each decade's color represents, and perhaps offer** a special petition relating to that area after you announce the mystery.

The Mission Rosary can also be prayed in a special way, using the “Mission Mysteries” developed by Maryknoll's mission organization. These mysteries are:

The 1st Mission Mystery: The visit of the Magi, the first missionaries (Matthew 2:1, 11)

The 2nd Mission Mystery: Jesus talks with the Samaritan woman, crossing borders/breaking down boundaries (John 4:28)

The 3rd Mission Mystery: Jesus cures the centurion's servant, acts of healing and service (Luke 7:2)

The 4th Mission Mystery: The conversion of Paul, expanding the faith to the Gentiles, the “other,” and thus the *world* (Acts 9:20)

The 5th Mission Mystery: Jesus sends out His disciples, we're all called to mission (Mark 16:15).

Un Mensaje de Padre Roberto

El Rosario de la Misión Mundial

Octubre es el mes del rosario y también el mes de las misiones mundiales en nuestra Iglesia católica. Entonces, es un momento apropiado para usar el Rosario de la Misión Mundial. Este rosario especial fue concebido por el arzobispo Fulton John Sheen, entonces director nacional de la Sociedad para la Propagación de la Fe, en 1951. Hizo la solicitud en un programa de radio de que sus oyentes **"Abracen el mundo en oración". Él introdujo este rosario. Su singularidad está en los cinco colores** representados en cada una de las décadas. El simbolismo del color en un rosario es un recordatorio amable en el que enfocar nuestras oraciones.

Este rosario honra el trabajo de la misión, nuestro llamado a ser misioneros y la y la paz unidad mundial a través de su énfasis especial en cada una de las regiones de la Tierra, donde se necesitan oraciones para todas las personas que viven, juegan y rezan ¡como cada uno de nosotros! Cada región está representada por un color diferente, no solo es un hermoso rosario, sino que es rico en simbolismo. Los colores/áreas del Rosario de la Misión incluyen:

Verde: para los bosques y praderas de África;

Rojo: recordando el fuego de la fe que trajo misioneros a las Américas (Estados Unidos, Canadá, América Latina y los nativos americanos);

Blanco - que simboliza Europa, el hogar del Santo Padre;

Azul: para el océano que rodea las Islas del Pacífico (Australia/Oceania);

Amarillo: simboliza la luz matutina de Oriente y el "comienzo de la civilización" para Asia/Oriente Medio; Estos colores no necesitan ir en ningún orden en particular en la elaboración del Rosario.

El Rosario de la Misión se puede rezar de la misma manera que rezarías cualquier otro rosario, ya sea en grupo, con tu familia o individualmente. Al rezar el Rosario de la Misión, puedes rezar los misterios que elijas rezar en ese momento y sus oraciones correspondientes para cada década. Simplemente ten en cuenta el área y todas las personas del mundo que representa

el color de cada década, y tal vez ofrezca una petición especial relacionada con esa área después de anunciar el misterio.

El Rosario de la Misión también se puede rezar de una manera especial, utilizando los "Misterios de la Misión" desarrollados por la organización misionera de Maryknoll. Estos misterios son:

El 1^{er} Misterio Misionero: la visita de los magos, los primeros misioneros (Mateo 2, 1, 11)

El 2^o Misterio Misionero: Jesús habla con la mujer samaritana, cruzando fronteras/rompiendo fronteras (Juan 4, 28)

El 3^{er} Misterio Misionero: Jesús sana al sirviente del centurión, los actos de curación y servicio (Lucas 7, 2)

El 4^o Misterio Misionero: la conversión de Pablo, expandiendo la fe a los gentiles, al "otro", y por lo tanto al mundo (Hechos 9, 20)

El 5^o Misterio Misionero: Jesús envía a sus discípulos, todos estamos llamados a la misión (Marcos 16, 15).
