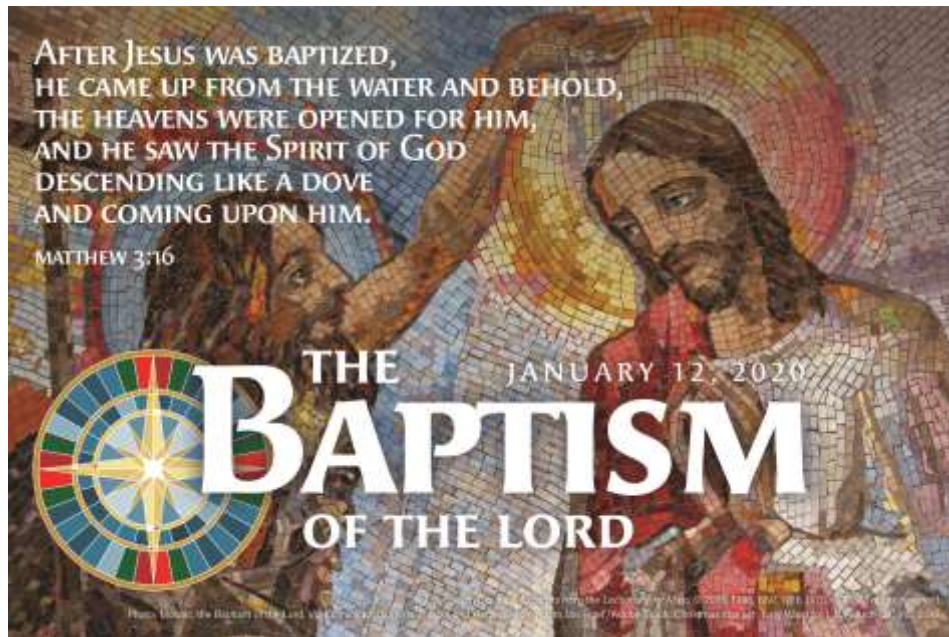

NotifyLA: Emergency Alerts from the City of Los Angeles

I received the following information recently, and I would like to pass it on to any interested parishioner.

In a disaster, there are never too many ways to receive a possibly life-saving alert. That's why the City of Los Angeles will use multiple ways to reach you if there is a threat to your life or property. The best way to ensure you receive alerts is **NotifyLA**. Sign up today! Create an account and enter your contact information using this link: <https://member.everbridge.net/index/453003085619167>.

**How Will You Receive an Alert?**

There are a variety of ways that the City of Los Angeles can reach you during an emergency. Residents are encouraged to sign up for all alert platforms relevant to where they live, work, and spend time in Los Angeles. Residents can provide multiple points of contacts, multiple addresses for alerts, and set language preferences by registering for the alert systems offered by the City of Los Angeles.

Sign Up for Alerts

The City of Los Angeles **strongly recommends** subscribing to both of the following systems:

NotifyLA – Create an account to receive urgent notifications about local emergencies by phone, email, and/or text message. Subscribe to alerts for your neighborhood, schools, businesses, media, and other interest areas. Powered by Everbridge.

Nixle – Text your **zip code to 888777 to opt-in** or sign up online to receive email, text or voice messages with alerts and advisories from local law enforcement. This will sign you up to receive alerts from all agencies using Nixle in your zip code.

Alerts that Do Not Require Subscriptions

The federal government allows the City of Los Angeles and County of Los Angeles to use two federal systems during emergencies. These systems **do not** require sign-up or registration.

Wireless Emergency Alerts (WEA) – Evacuation orders and other important messages will be sent to compatible mobile devices based on your current location.

Emergency Alert System (EAS) – Alerts will interrupt local radio broadcasts and Comcast television programming in the event of a large-scale emergency.

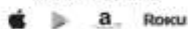

NotifyLA: Alertas de Emergencia de la Ciudad de Los Ángeles

Es por eso que la Ciudad de Los Ángeles usará múltiples formas de comunicarse con usted si existe una amenaza para su vida o propiedad. La mejor manera de asegurarse de recibir alertas es NotifyLA. ¡Regístrese hoy! ¿Cómo Recibirá una Alerta?

Hay una variedad de maneras con las que la ciudad de Los Ángeles puede llegar a usted durante una emergencia. Es recomendable que los residentes se inscriban en todas las plataformas de alerta en su lugar de residencia, trabajo y lugares de recreación y esparcimiento. Los residentes pueden proporcionar múltiples puntos de contacto, múltiples direcciones para alertas y establecer preferencias de idioma al registrarse en los sistemas de alerta ofrecidos por la Ciudad de Los Ángeles.

Regístrese para recibir alertas

La ciudad de Los Ángeles recomienda suscribirse a los dos sistemas siguientes:

NotifyLA: Cree una cuenta para recibir notificaciones urgentes sobre emergencias locales por teléfono, correo electrónico y / o mensaje de texto. Suscríbase a las alertas de su vecindario, escuelas, negocios, medios y otras áreas de interés. Desarrollado por Everbridge.

Nixle: Envíe un mensaje de texto con su código postal al 888777 para registrarse o suscribirse en línea para recibir correos electrónicos, mensajes de texto o de voz con alertas y avisos de las autoridades locales. Esto lo registrará para recibir alertas de todas las agencias que usan Nixle en su código postal.

Alertas que No Requieren Suscripciones

El gobierno federal permite que la Ciudad de Los Ángeles y el Condado de Los Ángeles utilicen dos sistemas federales durante emergencias. Estos sistemas no requieren registro.

Alertas de Emergencia Inalámbricas (WEA): Las órdenes de evacuación y otros mensajes importantes se enviarán a dispositivos móviles compatibles en función de su ubicación actual.

Sistema de Alerta de Emergencia (EAS): Las alertas interrumpirán las transmisiones de radio locales y la programación de televisión de Comcast en caso de una emergencia a gran escala.
