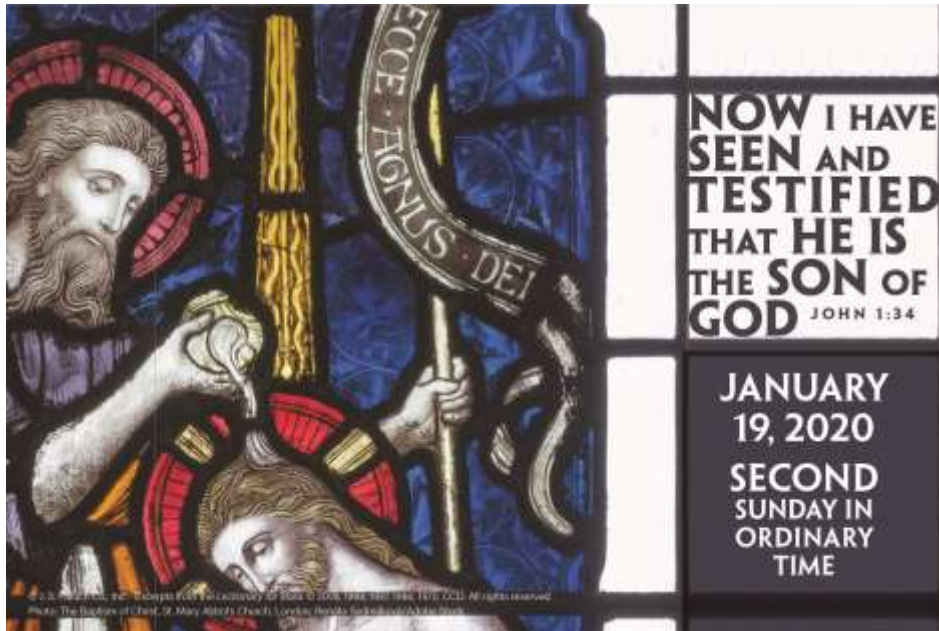

A Message from Fr. Roberto

The Mother of God – Part 2

Continued from two weeks ago: Here are five basic points that explain why we Catholic Christians honor our Blessed Mother – please learn them so you can teach them to your children and also to explain your Catholic Christian faith if you are ever asked why we Catholics love and honor Mary so much. References to the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* below are denoted by “CCC.”

Catholics do not worship Mary – or any of the saints for that matter; **Catholics worship God alone.**

We honor Mary, most importantly, because she is the mother of Jesus who is God and Savior.

Every special honor we ascribe to Mary is based on her motherhood of Jesus. That is why we call her the “Mother of God,” and “Mother of the Church.” That is why we believe in her Immaculate Conception (she was born without Original Sin in order that she would be a worthy vessel to give birth to Jesus), her Assumption into heaven, and her role as intercessor on behalf of all people. We also honor her numerous appearances throughout the history of the Church, e.g., Lourdes, Fatima, Guadalupe, etc. (see CCC #'s 508ff., 721, 2673ff.).

We honor Mary because of the holiness of her life (see Luke Chapter 1).

She is present at key moments in Jesus’ life and in the life of the Church: at his first miracle in Cana (John 2); at the foot of the cross (John 19:26-27); and at Pentecost (Acts 1:14) (see CCC #494).

Honoring Mary is biblical: she is called “full of grace” and said to “have found favor with God” by the Archangel Gabriel (Luke 1:28, 30); she is called “blessed...among women” and “the mother of my Lord” by Elizabeth (Luke 1:42-43); she herself says “all generations will call me blessed...” (Luke 1:48). All these Scriptures highlight Mary’s special role and favor in God’s eyes.

Honoring Mary is honoring God and honoring Jesus: God chose Mary to be the mother of his Son, so she was special to God (see Luke 1:30). Mary is Jesus’ mother, so she must have been special to him as well (see John 19:26-27). Human beings often honor their mothers and other important people in special ways. For example, all of us have heroes, people we admire and want to emulate – be they the saints of our Church, sports figures, entertainment personalities, politicians, family members, friends, etc. – and none of these special honors we give to these human beings detracts from the worship and honor we offer to God. Unfortunately, some Catholics do exaggerate Mary’s role and importance, forgetting that she is a human being and not a goddess; but, as Matthew Kelly, the Catholic evangelist, says, the abuse of a good does not diminish its goodness. In other words, just because some Catholics don’t get it right does not mean that devotion to Mary is wrong.

Mary’s role in our Catholic faith is always to lead us to her Son, Jesus, and, therefore, ultimately to God. So let us continue to honor Mary as she deserves, and, through our devotion to her, let us follow her to Jesus. Un Mensaje de Padre Roberto

La Madre de Dios – Parte 2

Continuado desde hace dos semanas: Aquí están cinco puntos básicos que explican por qué los católicos cristianos honramos a nuestra Madre Santísima. Por favor, apréndelos para que puedas enseñarlos a tus hijos y explicar tu fe católica a las personas que preguntan por qué los católicos honramos tanto a la Virgen. Las referencias al *Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica* a continuación se indican con "CCC".

Los católicos no adoramos a María – o a cualquier otro de los santos; **los católicos adoramos sólo a Dios.**

Sobre todo, honramos a María porque ella es la madre de Jesús, quien es Dios y Salvador. Cada honor especial que atribuimos a María se basa en su maternidad de Jesús. Es por eso que la llamamos la "Madre de Dios" y "Madre de la Iglesia." Es por eso que creemos en su Inmaculada Concepción (nació sin pecado original con el fin de que ella fuera un recipiente digno de dar a luz a Jesús), su Asunción al cielo, y su papel como intercesor en nombre de todas las personas. También honramos sus numerosas apariciones en toda la historia de la Iglesia, por ejemplo, las de Guadalupe, Lourdes y Fátima, etc. (ver CIC # 's 508ff., 721, 2673ff.).

Honramos a María por la santidad de su vida (ver Lucas capítulo 1). Ella está presente en momentos claves de la vida de Jesús y en la vida de la Iglesia: en su primer milagro en Caná (Juan 2); al pie de la cruz (Juan 19,26-27); y en Pentecostés (Hechos 1, 14) (ver CIC # 494).

Honrar a María es bíblico: ella es llamada "llena de gracia, y se le dijo "has hallado gracia ante Dios" por el Arcángel Gabriel (Lucas 1:28, 30); se llama "bendita... entre las mujeres" y "la madre de mi Señor" por Isabel (Lucas 1:42-43); ella misma dice "todas las generaciones me llamarán bienaventurada..." (Lucas 1:48). Todas estas Escrituras destacan el papel especial de María y su favor a los ojos de Dios.

Honrar a María es honrar a Dios y honrar a Jesús: Dios eligió a María para que fuera la Madre de su Hijo, así que ella era especial para Dios (ver Lucas 1:30). María es la madre de Jesús, por lo que debe haber sido especial para él también (ver Juan 19:26-27). Los seres humanos a menudo honran a sus madres y a otras personas importantes en formas especiales. Por ejemplo, todos tenemos héroes, personas que admiramos y queremos emular – ya sean los santos de la Iglesia, figuras del deporte, personalidades del espectáculo, políticos, miembros de la familia, amigos, etc. – y ninguno de estos honores especiales dados a los seres humanos le quita el culto y el honor que se ofrece a Dios. Por desgracia, algunos católicos han exagerado el papel de María

y su importancia, olvidando que ella es un ser humano y no una diosa. Pero el abuso de un bien no disminuye su bondad. En otras palabras, sólo porque algunos católicos no lo hacen bien no quiere decir que la devoción a María sea errónea.

El papel de María en nuestra fe católica siempre es llevarnos a su Hijo Jesús y, por lo tanto, últimamente a Dios. Entonces, honremos a María como merece, y, a través de nuestra devoción a ella, sigámosla hacia Jesús. Para mayor información ver: <http://www.aciprensa.com/apologetica/maria.htm>
